

JAPANESE GOVERNMENT (MONBUKAGAKUSHO:MEXT) SCHOLARSHIP FOR 2012 (THAILAND)
(COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY STUDENTS)

Ministry of Education, Culture, Sports, Science and Technology (MEXT) and the Embassy of Japan in Thailand offer scholarships to Thai students who wish to study at Japanese college of technology under the Japanese Government (Monbukagakusho: MEXT) Scholarship Program for 2012 as follows.

1. FIELDS OF STUDY

Fields of Study	Majors and Related Key Terms
1. Mechanical Engineering	Machine Elements and Material Processing, Material Science and Mechanics, Fluid and Thermal Engineering, Mechanical System Design and Control, Computer Aided Design/ Computer Aided Manufacturing, Mechatronics, Robotics, etc.
2. Electrical and Electronic Engineering	Analog Circuits, Electric Power System, Power Electronics, Digital Circuits, Integrated Circuits, Electric/Electronic Materials, Electric/Electronic Device, Electric/Electronic Control, etc.
3. Information Communication and Network Engineering	Signal/Image Processing, Cable Communication, Wireless Communication, Communication Engineering, Satellite Communication, Microwaves, Computer Software, Computer Graphics, Operating System, Peripherals and Interface Technology, Computer Network, Communication Control, etc.
4. Materials Engineering	Metallurgical Engineering, Inorganic Materials Engineering, Organic Materials Engineering, Polymer Chemistry, Chemical Engineering, Biological Chemistry, Biological Engineering, Environmental Engineering in Materials Science and Engineering, etc.
5. Architecture and Civil Engineering	Architectural Design and Planning, Structural Engineering in Architecture, Building Materials and Execution Works, History of Architecture, Structural Engineering, Materials in Civil Engineering, Surveying, Hydraulics, Geotechnical Engineering, Urban Engineering, etc.
6. Maritime Engineering	Navigation, Position Fixing, Ship Maneuvering and Seamanship, Oceanography and Meteorology, Maritime Laws, Naval Architecture, Marine Diesel Engine, Marine Auxiliary Machinery, Marine Material, etc.
7. Other Fields	International Communication, Management Information Engineering, etc.

Note 1 : Applicants must select a “Field of study” and “Majors and Related Key Terms” and enter in “Chosen field of study in Japan” on the application form. Applicants may enter a first, second and third choice of field of study. For each of the three choices be sure to enter your desired subject of study, referring to the “Majors and Related Key Terms for Fields of Study.”

Note 2 : “Materials engineering” may not be studied in combination with other fields of study. Applicants wishing to choose more than one major, should select their first, second and third choice from within Materials engineering.

Note 3 : Applicants for a major in the fields categorized as “Other Fields” , may have difficulties in finding colleges of technology capable of accepting them.

2. QUALIFICATIONS

- (1) Nationality:
Applicants must have Thai nationality. However, the applicant who has Japanese nationality at the time of application will not be eligible. Applicant screening will be made at the Embassy of Japan in Thailand.
- (2) Age:
Applicants must be from 17 to 21 years old as of April 1, 2012 (i.e. born between April 2, 1990 and April 1, 1995).
- (3) Academic Background:
Upper Secondary School Student at Grade 12 (Mathayomsuksa 6) who will graduate by March, 2012.
- (4) Academic Records (GPA)
Applicants must have more than 3.00 in cumulative average credits at an upper secondary school.
- (5) Japanese Language:
Applicant must be willing to learn the Japanese language and receive college of technology education in it.
- (6) Health:
Applicant must be mentally and physically healthy enough to pursue study at a college of technology in Japan. Applicant who wishes to major in maritime engineering must have 0.6 or more vision in either eye with or without glasses, and no color-blindness.
- (7) Arrival in Japan:
In principle, the selected Applicant must be able to leave for and arrive in Japan between the 1st and 7th of April 2012. Travel expenses will not be provided if the Applicant chooses to travel to Japan before this set period. If the Applicant is unable to travel to Japan within the dates set, the scholarship will be cancelled.
- (8) Visa Requirement:
If selected, Applicant will be required to acquire a “College Student, (*ryuugaku* (留学))” visa prior to coming to Japan. (Applicant who comes to Japan with a visa or resident status other than that of “College Student” will not qualify for a Japanese government’s scholarship. Also keep in mind that Applicant who changes his/her resident status to any status other than “College Student” after entry into Japan will lose his/her status of a Japanese government scholarship student upon such change of status.)
- (9) Any applicant who meets any or all of the following conditions is not eligible. If identified after the start of the scholarship period, the applicant will be required to withdraw from the scholarship:
 - ①. If he/she is a service member or civilian employee registered on the active military list at the time the scholarship period is due to begin;
 - ②. If he/she is a grantee of a scholarship from an organization (including a governmental organization of his/her own country) other than the Japanese government (MONBUKAGAKUSHO: MEXT);
 - ③. If the applicant is a previous recipient of a Japanese government scholarship. Unless more than three years have passed since the first day of the month following the final payment of the previous scholarship, as of April 1, 2012; or
 - ④. If he/she is, in principle, currently enrolled in a Japanese university with the resident status of “College Student,” or will be enrolled in a Japanese university as an other source or self financed international student between the time of application for this scholarship in his/her country and the time the scholarship period is due to begin. This does not apply to current self-financed international students at Japanese universities who will complete their course of study and return to their country before the end of the current year.

3. TERM OF SCHOLARSHIP

Scholarship awards will be tenable for four years from April, 2012 to March, 2016 including one-year preparatory education in the Japanese language and other subjects due to be provided upon arrival in Japan. For scholarship grantees majoring in maritime engineering, the term of scholarship will be four and a half years up to September, 2016.

Note: If a grantee graduates from a college of technology and is admitted for enrollment in an advanced course at a college of technology or university as a junior transferee, he/she may have the term of his/her scholarship extended upon successful examination by MEXT provided that he/she has outstanding academic achievement that meets certain criteria. If a grantee completes an advanced course at a college of technology and satisfies the requirements established by the National Institution for Academic Degrees and University Evaluation, he/she may apply to the Institution for a bachelor's degree in engineering.

4. SCHOLARSHIP BENEFITS

(1) Allowance:

Under the fiscal 2011 budget each grantee will be provided monthly with 123,000 yen (and additional monthly stipend of 2,000 or 3,000 yen may be provided to those undertaking study or research in specially designated regions.) (However, this will be subject to change, depending upon the annual budget of each year). The scholarship will not be paid to a grantee who takes a leave of absence or is long absent from his/her college of technology or the preparatory Japanese-teaching institution.

The scholarship will be cancelled for a grantee in the following cases. Furthermore, if scholarship payments were made during the period the following cases applied, the grantee may be ordered to return scholarship payments received during that period.

- ①. If any of his/her application documents is found to be falsely stated;
- ②. If he/she is in breach of his/her pledge made to MONBUKAGAKUSHO (MEXT);
- ③. If he/she is subjected to disciplinary action such as expulsion or removal from register by his/her college of technology or the preparatory Japanese-teaching institution;
- ④. If it becomes definitive that the grantee will not be able to graduate(or complete his/her course) within the standard course term because of his/her poor academic achievement or suspension;
- ⑤. If his/her resident status of "College Student" as provided for in Paragraph 1-4 of Appendix to the Immigration Control and Refugee Recognition Act changes to any other status; or
- ⑥. If he/she is provided with another scholarship (except for a scholarship designated for research expenses).
- ⑦. If he/she proceeds to a higher level of education without receiving approval for an extension of the term of the scholarship.

(2) Traveling Costs

- ①. Transportation to Japan :
Each grantee will be provided, according to his/her itinerary and route as designated by MEXT, with an economy class air ticket from the international airport closest to his/her place of residence to Narita International Airport (or following the itinerary normally used by the institution where the grantee is placed). Expenses such as inland transportation from his/her place of residence to the nearest international airport, airport

tax, airport usage charges, special taxes on overseas travel and travel expenses within Japan will be borne by the grantee (the place of residence of the grantee shall in principle be the address stated in the application form). Air travel from a country other than the grantee's nationality will not be covered, nor travel to Japan before April 1, 2012.

②. Transportation from Japan:

A grantee who returns to his/her home country within the last month of scholarship payment will be provided, upon application, with an economy class air ticket for a flight from Narita International Airport (or following the itinerary normally used by the institution where the grantee is placed) to the international airport closest to his/her place of return.

Note: Insurance premiums for travel to/from Japan shall be borne by the grantee.

The airport the grantee departs from or returns to must be an airport of the country of his/her nationality.

③. School Fees:

Fees for entrance examinations, matriculation and tuition at a college of technology will be paid by the Japanese government.

5. SELECTION AND APPLICATION PROCEDURE IN THAILAND

The Embassy of Japan and the Ministry of Education, the Thai Government will select preliminary candidates from among applicants by means of examination and interview.

(1) Announcement of Application

As the Ministry of Education will decide.

(2) Distributing of Application Form

As the Ministry of Education will decide.

(3) Acceptance of Application Form

Date: The period that the Ministry of Education will decide.

***These documents must be written in either Japanese or English, or accompanied by a translation in either of these languages. No application will be accepted unless all the documents mentioned above are fully and correctly completed. The documents submitted will not be returned.**

(B) Subjects of Examination

English, Mathematics and Physics or Chemistry

Note: All applicants wishing to study (4) “Materials engineering” must sit examinations in English, Mathematics and Chemistry.

All applicants wishing to study in fields other than (4) “Materials engineering” must sit examinations in English, Mathematics, and Physics.

(C) Examination Language

All subjects are given in English.

6. RECOMMENDATION TO MEXT

The Embassy of Japan will recommend the candidates who have passed the preliminary selection to MEXT. In addition, all candidates are required to take the Japanese Examination as reference data to decide how much Japanese language training needs to be given to a grantee after their arrival in Japan.

(4) Final Selection at MEXT

MEXT will perform the final selection among the recommended candidates worldwide and select the scholarship grantees. Therefore, applicants who have passed the primary screening at the Japanese legation (the Embassy of Japan) are not automatically accepted as scholarship grantees.

7. COLLEGE OF TECHNOLOGY EDUCATION

(1) Preparatory Education prior to Placement in College of Technology:

Each grantee will be enrolled at a preparatory school designated by MEXT for a one-year intensive course in the Japanese language and other subjects necessary for preparation for proceeding to college of technology. The preparatory course lasts for one year, mainly consisting of education in the Japanese language as well as in Japanese Affairs, mathematics, etc. Please keep in mind that a grantee will not be allowed to proceed to college of technology if he/she is determined incapable of completing the prescribed course at the preparatory school. (He/she will be required to return home upon such determination.)

(2) Entrance into College of Technology:

A grantee who has completed the prescribed course at the preparatory school will go on to a college of technology designated by MEXT. The college of technology will be decided by MEXT upon consultation with the college concerned. No objection by the grantee against the decision will be allowed.

(3) Graduation:

A college of technology operates under a five-year course requiring junior high school education for eligibility, but the grantees of this scholarship will be enrolled into a third-year class and receive specialized education for three years prior to graduation (or three years and a half for those who major in maritime engineering). A graduated grantee will be awarded a diploma and an associate degree.

- (4) Language Used in Education:
All classes will be given in the Japanese language.
- (5) Change of Major Field:
A grantee will not be permitted in principle to change his/her major field of study.

8. NOTES

- (1) All grantees are advised to learn the Japanese language and have basic knowledge about the weather, climate, manners and customs, and colleges of technology education in Japan as well as about the differences in the Japanese legal system and the one in their home country before they leave for Japan.
- (2) Grantees should bring the approximate equivalent of US\$1,500 to cover immediate needs after their arrival in Japan.
- (3) Dormitory
- ①. For one year after arrival each grantee will be able to live in a dormitory for preparatory school.
 - ②. After entering a college of technology a grantee will be able to live in the dormitory established by the college.
- (4) If you have any question about the matters set forth/not set forth herein or that are unclear, inquire at the Japanese Embassy/Consulate-General, and follow their instructions, if any are given.
